Our ward is presently without a councillor to represent residents at City Council. This fact also means that Scarborough has one less vote. It is AVCA Executive understanding that either an appointment will be made or a by-election will be held. This decision is to be voted on at the October City Council Meeting. Southwest Scarborough Transportation Study

City of Toronto is proposing a new street and multi-purpose trail (pedestrian and cyclist) to connect Village Green Square to Sheppard Avenue. The study is ongoing and many residents participated in the teleconference on September 23, 2020. Further information can be secured by contacting Stephanie Gris Bringas at 416 392 3643.

Pedestrian and Cyclist Community Access

Of great concern to many residents is traffic speed and traffic congestion in our community. We also experience cyclists using sidewalks due to unsafe street access and lack of bike lanes. We are fortunate to have many waterways, parks and Highland Creek in our area, however the pathways along these areas do not connect. The new Agincourt GO Station has limited parking and proposed new bike shelters with no safe cycling access. The Agincourt Mall Development proposes pedestrian and cycle pathways, however they go nowhere. Pedestrians have expressed safety concerns accessing Kennedy Commons along Kennedy Road and under the 401. Through the Southwest Scarborough Transportation Study and ActiveTO on Huntingwood Avenue there may be an opportunity to create a safer network for pedestrians and cyclists.
