June 2021 Update



Multi-Tenant Housing

As discussed at previous AVCA AGMs and at signed petitions at our former Yard Sales, AVCA has taken the stand to oppose legalizing Rooming Houses (Multi-Tenant Housing) in Scarborough. Rhoda Potter and many other members have attended and posed questions at the recent Online Public Meetings. Many of you answered the survey. Thank you!

A formal letter of opposition is being sent to the City Planning & Housing Committee from AVCA regarding legalizing Multi-Tenant Housing as it is presently proposed. The virtual public meeting, on video, is to be held on Monday June 28 at 1:30 pm

The meeting is being conducted by the Planning and Housing Committee (PHC) as an extension of their final Monthly Meeting before summer break. Submissions can be made to the meeting by presentation or in writing. The PHC will receive input and review the staff proposal in order to make recommendations to the Toronto City Council for their consideration. Further details are as follows:

Stouffville Corridor Train Noise and Noise Wall Concerns

AVCA continues to voice to Metrolinx, the concerns of residents living along the train tracks. Our last virtual meeting was in February 2021 with Randy MacDougall and Rhoda Potter pressing Metrolinx for valid noise testing and appropriate noise mitigation, especially since, when completed, train noise interruptions can be every 4 minutes during the day. Unfortunately, we have no news to report from Metrolinx or our MPP Aris Babikian. AVCA's discussions will continue. Agincourt GO Station

Construction on the new station continues. Your AVCA Executive meets monthly and virtually with the Metrolinx Community Liaison Committee to learn the station progress and to highlight community concerns and suggestions. Discussion topics have included security cameras, lighting, accessible access to the station, pathways, drainage on adjacent properties, noise wall completion, pedestrian and cycling connections and station artwork.

Scarborough Subway - McCowan Station

You may have noticed the demolition of the car dealerships on the northeast corner of McCowan and Sheppard. This is to make way for the beginning of the boring of the tunnel for the subway which will extend from McCowan Station to Kennedy Station. More information can be found at metrolinxengage.com.

Wild Animal Support

We live in a beautiful neighbourhood where we experience many encounters with different types of wildlife, raccoons, skunks, opossums, foxes, coyotes, squirrels, a variety of birds including birds of prey. In the majority of cases all of these creatures are harmless if left alone and will not bother or harm you, but in some cases animals may need assistance due to injury or abandonment, or they can be causing damage to a property. If you encounter either scenario, we urge that you do not try to engage with the animal on your own and that you contact a trained professional in wildlife rescue or wildlife control to assist with the situation. 
