### **Multi-Tenant Housing**

As discussed at previous AVCA AGMs and at signed petitions at our former Yard Sales, AVCA has taken the stand to oppose legalizing Rooming Houses (Multi-Tenant Housing) in Scarborough. Rhoda Potter recently met with other Scarborough Community Association Presidents as we continue to oppose this proposal.

City Council deferred the vote on legalization of multi-tenant housing with recommendations for review of the plan directed to City staff. The report is due back sometime in 2022. Information is available at <u>www.toronto.ca</u>.

## Stouffville Corridor Train Noise and Noise Wall Concerns

AVCA continues to voice to Metrolinx, the concerns of residents living along the train tracks. The noise wall concern is always raised at our virtual Agincourt GO Station CLC meetings and AVCA is in constant contact with our MPP Aris Babikian. Metrolinx continues to study the matter. As the number and duration of the trains are increasing following their reduction during COVID, you are encouraged to address your concerns regarding train noise to to torontoeast@metrolinx.com.

### **Agincourt GO Station**

Construction on the new station continues. Your AVCA Executive meets monthly and virtually with the Metrolinx Community Liaison Committee to learn the station progress and to highlight community concerns and suggestions. Recent discussion topics have included improvement of lighting, condition and maintenance of the Lockie to Tracks Pathway as well as the Marilyn to Tracks Sidewalk; no GO

Station access to washrooms, seating, phone plug-ins, amenities and bike storage after 11:00 am on weekdays or anytime on weekends, and security at the North Pedestrian Tunnel area. AVCA hopes the new Agincourt GO Station will completely open soon!

## **Finch Smart Track GO Station**

Information will be coming soon regarding the building of this station. AVCA has expressed concern that there will be no parking, cycling on Finch Avenue is unsafe and pedestrians will need to walk long distances to catch a train at Finch Smart Track Station due to the way surrounding communities were planned. Commuters must be dropped off by a friend at the Kiss n Ride, take a TTC bus and pay another fare to board the GO train or pay taxi fare to reach the Finch Smart Track GO Station. # Scarborough Subway – McCowan Station

AVCA continues to participate in meetings regarding the beginning of the Scarborough Subway Big Dig at the corner of McCowan and Sheppard. Metrolinx is starting the digging of the tunnel at this location and burrowing south to Kennedy Station. Our concern for the McCowan Subway station is that there is NO COMMUTER PARKING planned for the station. The plan for this station is to have a bus terminal only. # Sheppard Subway – McCowan to Don Mills

AVCA wishes to clarify that the Scarborough Subway does not continue along Sheppard Avenue from McCowan to Don Mills. At present the Sheppard Subway is only a dotted line on the Metrolinx map and is not funded. ### **Huntingwood Drive Bike Lanes**

As many Agincourt residents cycle on sidewalks for their own safety AVCA is in contact virtually with Cycle Toronto to improve safe cycling in North Scarborough. AVCA is looking forward to the resurfacing of Huntingwood Avenue with safer and more appealing vehicle and cycle designation. As North Scarborough is the only area in Toronto without Bike Share and the Bike Share Loop, AVCA is working to help those who would like to rent a bike for periods of time. A Bike Share location is being proposed for Agincourt GO Station.

### Derelict Building at Midland/Sheppard- 4189 Sheppard Avenue

For 20+ years our community has been exposed to this run down building frequented by trespassers, broken fences, graffiti and dumping! We will not take it anymore! Housing is needed in Toronto – why hasn't this land been developed? Due to the many condominium developments our area is experiencing reduction in recreational and park facility opportunities – why can't this land be taken over by the City of Toronto to meet the recreational needs of the present and many residents moving into our area? Expand the diagram and note the percent change in parkland provision in our area by 2033 due to development. (-50%)




Figure 11: Impact of Growth on Parkland Provision, by Percent Change

### Planning Complete Communities – Toronto City Planning

AVCA is following the city planning to increase housing resulting from the provincial Growth Plan for the Golden Horseshoe. Our community is located in close proximity to higher order transportation ie Metrolinx Stouffville Corridor and thus impacted by housing planning around major transit stations. Garden suites, duplexes, triplexes, and low-rise housing on major streets are being discussed.
