Crossing Guard Requests

AVCA continues to advocate for community safety. The administration of Crossing Guards on August 1, 2019 will be taken over by the City of Toronto when the program will be transferred from Toronto police Services. New Crossing Guard requests must be submitted by July 31, 2019 to <u>www.toronto.ca/SchoolCrossingGuard</u>. A review process will take place.

AVCA has requested Crossing Guards at two locations:

- Midland Avenue and Lockie Avenue
- Sheppard Avenue and Entrance to Agincourt GO Station (Reidmount Avenue)

The review process will take six to eight months to confirm results of the requests.

Agincourt Mall Redevelopment

On June 25, 2019 at Scarborough Community Council approval was given to amend the Official Plan Application for 3850 and 3900 Sheppard Avenue East and 2350-2362 Kennedy Road (Agincourt Mall) to provide for comprehensive redevelopment of the lands. This will allow for multi-phased, mixed use development consisting of residential, commercial and office uses in a variety of building types.
