Online Reporting for Neighbourhood Traffic Issues/Concerns

As part of the modernization of the Toronto Police Service, an Online Reporting Tool was developed to allow residents to report Neighbourhood Traffic Issues/Concerns (speeding, disobeying stop signs, turn signs, parking, etc.) and Driving Complaints (an example would be someone cutting off, or made an illegal turn, or was on their cell phone while driving).

What you report online will go directly to 42 Division and be assigned to a traffic enforcement officer. When reporting, access <http://torontopolice.on.ca/core/>.

You can then choose either "Local Neighbourhood Traffic Issue or Concern" or "Driving Complaint" (as circled in the image above), and the system will prompt you to enter all the relevant information.

Traffic Congestion

We have it NOW and WORSE is coming! Imagine how bad it will be with the rail crossing gates coming down and traffic stopped every seven minutes, all day long, waiting while trains pass by at the Huntingwood, Havendale, Progress, and McNicoll level crossings with NO grade separations. Whether you are going to work, taking children to school, shopping, or going to appointments, traffic congestion is our future with SmartTrack/Metrolinx train increases unless grade separations are built.

The Hansen Report issued in January 2018 does not list any City, Provincial, or Metrolinx budget for grade separations for these crossings. The City is ignoring us and we are not getting these needed grade separations, only traffic congestion. We suffer with the transport of people from 905 to downtown. We must advocate for our Scarborough communities!
